



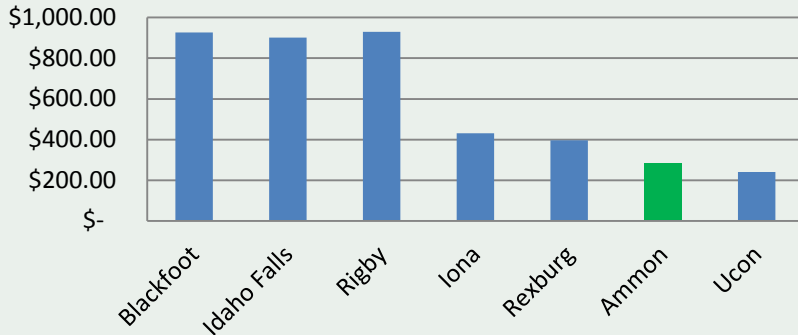
2014 Budget Highlights

The City of Ammon fiscal year 2014 runs October 1, 2013 to September 30, 2014

- Total budget is \$16,281,738.
- Increases in utility rates are minimal, due to increases in operational costs.
- Total of 31 full time employees for 14,199 population (2012 estimate from census.gov). This equates to one employee for every 458 residents.
- The City of Ammon continues to move forward with its strategic plan goals of:
 - Improve infrastructure (streets, water system, waste-water system)
 - Long term financial stability
 - Community planning
 - Improve technology based communications
 - Enhance public safety and improve pedestrian/bicycle facilities
 - Enhance recreational opportunities within our City and support surrounding communities

Property Tax Breakdown and Comparison with Nearby Cities

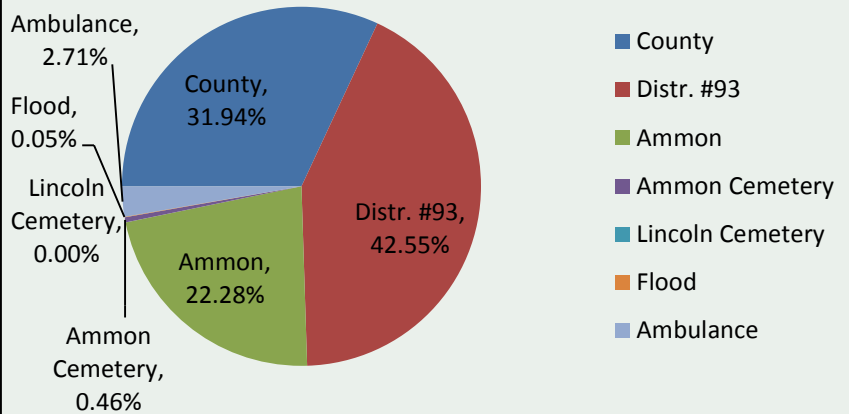
2012 Property Tax Levy per \$100,000 Value



The chart at the left compares 2012 Ammon levies with nearby cities. The total for Ammon is one of the lowest in the area, region, and state.

Your property tax dollars paid to Bonneville County are distributed to the following entities listed in the pie chart to the right. As the chart shows, only 22% of your tax payment goes to the City of Ammon. Property tax dollars paid to the City of Ammon in fiscal year 2014 are estimated to be \$1,982,462.
